Painting has always been the predominant medium for artists in Ethiopia. The development of the modern art movement in the country can be traced to the deeply rooted and influence of church paintings. However, in every generation, artists have addressed socio-cultural, historic, economic and political issues and this is even more evident in the contemporary art scene.

As most contemporary artists live and work in Addis, their work depicts what is happening all over Ethiopia; the turbulence caused by the dramatic development and transformation of the country. These changes are a source of inspiration for most of the artists exhibited

The II artists showing in the exhibition 'Addis Contemporary' at the Circle Art Gallery, Nairobi describe their experience of a fast changing Addis during this critical period of its history. Through imaginative, conceptual and perceptual frameworks, the happenings in the city can be traced in their art:

Dawit Abebe's concepts of *In Between*; Yosef Lule's *Past + Future*; Tesfaye Bekele's *Cross Roads*; Surafel Amare's impressions arising from banana displays; Addis Gezahegn's nostalgic fantasies of *Old Town* and Ephrem Solomon's social commentary are critical reflections of Addis life.

Other artists' work reflect more artistic preoccupations: Dawit Adnew's obsession for patterns; Kerima Ahmed's portrayal of contorted forms; Nebiat Abebe's exploration of movement, light and balance; Dereje Demissie's search for the link between identity and landscape and Tamrat Gezahegn's meditation on indigenous knowledge and practice.

There is a large community of artists in Addis who persevere despite a still-limited art audience in the country. Exhibitions like 'Addis Contemporary' that address the essence of the contemporary art scene of Addis in depth, will create a new platform to expose Ethiopian artists who have not received proper attention either at home or abroad.

It is my belief that a lot will come out of 'Addis Contemporary'!

አዲስ ዘመንኛ

በኢትዮጵያ የሥነ-ጥበብ ታሪክ የቀለም ቅብ ለዘመናት የዘለቀ ኪነ-ቁስ ነው። በዘመናዊው የኢትዮጵያ የሥነ-ጥበብ እንቅስቃሴና እድገት ውስጥም የቤተ-ክርስቲያን የቀለም ቅብ ሥራዎች ስር የሰደደና ወሳኝ ተጽዕኖ አላቸው። ሆኖም ግን በእያንዳንዱ ዘመናዊ የኢትዮጵያ የሥነ-ጥበብ ታሪክ ውስጥ ያለፉ ሥዓልያን የሃገሪቱን ማሕበራዊ፡ ባሕላዊ፡ ታሪካዊ፡ ኤኮኖሚያዊና ፖለቲካዊ ርዕሰ ነገሮችን ሲያነሱ ቆይተዋል፡ ይህ ደግሞ በዘመንኛው የኢትዮጵያ ሥነ-ጥበብ ሂደትና ዓውድ ውስጥ በአያሴው ይንጸባረቃል። አብዛኛዎቹ የሃገራችን ዘመንኛ ሥዓልያን ኑሮና ሥራቸው በመዲናችን የመሆኑን ያህል ተመስመና ኪናዊ አትኩሮታቸው በከተማዋና በሃገሪቱ እየታየ ካለው ክስተት ላይ ያተኩራል ይመነጫል። የኢትዮጵያችን የእድገትና የለውጥ ትዕይንታዊ ነውጥ በቀጥታም ሆነ በተዘዋዋሪ፡ ሲያልፍም ሆነ ሲያገድም፡ ዕይታዊ-አውነታዊ-ሃሳባዊም በሆነ መንገድ ይኮረኩራቸዋል፡ የጥበባዊ መነቃቂያ ምንጭና መዳረሻ በመሆን ለአያሴዎቹ የሃገራችን ዘመንኛ ሥዓልያን የማርያም መንገድ እየሆነ ይገኛል።

ይህ በኬንያ ናይሮቢ፡ በሰርክል አርት ኃለሪ የተከወነው የአስራ አንዱ ሥዓልያን 'አዲስ ዘመንኛ ' የተሰኘው ትርዲት ሥዓልያኑ ወሳኝ በሆነ የታሪክ ምዕራፍ ላይ የምትገኘው የአዲስ አበባ ልምዳቸውንና ከተማዋና ሃገሪቱ ውስጥ በመኖራቸው ያዳበሩትን እሳቤ አንጸባራቂ ነው። ሃሳባዊ ምፕቀትን፡ ስሌተ-ሃሳብንና ስሜትን የሚከተሉ ሃሳቦቻቸውን መሰረት በማድረግ የኪነ-ቅብ ሥራዎቻቸውን ፈለግ ከከተማዋና ከሃገሪቱ ነባራዊ ክስተቶች ኃር የሚወራረሱበትን መስመሮች መንቀስ ይቻላል።

የዳዊት አበበ 'በመሃከል' ፡ የዮሴፍ ሉሌ ያለፈው + የወደፊቱ ፡ የተስፋዬ በቀለ 'ተልፍልፍ መንገዶች' ፡ የሱራፌል አማረ 'የመዝ ድርድሮች' ፡ የአዲስ ገዛኧኝ ህልማዊና ትዝታዊ 'ያረጁ ከተሞች' እንዲሁም የኤፍራም ሰለሞን ማሕበረሰብ ተኮር አስተያየቶች ሁሉ በአዲስ አበባና በኢትዮጵያ ያለውን የሕይወት ገጽ ሥዓልያኑ ከሚሰማቸውና ከሚያስቡት ማዕቀፍ በመነሳት የሰላ ሂሳቸውን ያንጸባረቁበት ስሌተ-ሃሳባዊ የሥነ-ተበብ ሥራዎቻቸውን እነሆ በረከት ብለዋል።

የሴሎቹ ሥዓልያን ሥራዎች ይበልጡኑ ወደ ሥነ-ተበባዊ ዝንባልዎቻቸው በማተኮር ከላይ የተጠቀሰውን የመዲናችንንና የሃገራችንን እውነታዎች እንድናሰላስል። እንድናዛምድና አንድናስተነትን እድል የሚሰጡ ናቸው። ዳዊት አድነው ለተሰኖኙ የመስመሮች የቀለማትና የቅርጾችን ውህደት ለመጠቆም የሚያሳየው መብሰክሰክ። ከሪጣ አህመድ ለተርንረባበጡና ለተጠመዛዘዙ ዝርገ-ቅርጾች የምትሰጠው አጽንኦት። ነቢያት አበበ እንቅስቃሴ ብርሃንና ሚዛን ላይ የምታደር ጋቸው ዳሰሳዎች። ደረጀ ደምሴ በሰው ልጅ ማንነትና በመልክዓ-ምድር መሃከል ያለውን ቁርኝት ለመግለጥ ሚያከናውናቸው ሙከራዎችና ጥናቶች። ታምራት ገዛኧኝ ሃገር በቀል ዕውቀት ጥበባትና ተግባራቶች ላይ የሚያቀብለን ተመስመዎቹ ሁሉ ከከተማችንና ከሃገራችን ወቅታዊ ሁኔታ በመነሳትና ኃያል የሥነ-ጥበብ ተሰጥኦዋቸውን በመጠቀም ቀላልና ወዛም በሆነ የሥነ-ጥበብ ለዛ ከፍታቸውን እንድንቋደስ የጥበብ ሥራዎቻቸውን እንካችሁ

የሥነ-ጥበብ ተመልካችና አድናቂ በእጅጉ ውስን በሆነባት በኢትዮጵያችንና በአዲስ አበባችን ለሙያቸው በጽንአት የቆሙ በርካታ ሥዓልያን ይገኛሉ። ስለ ዘመንኛው የሃገራችን ሥነ-ጥበብ በጥልቀት የሚዘጋጁ እንደ 'አዲስ ዘመንኛ ' ያሉ ትርዒቶች በሃገር ቤትም ሆነ በባህር ማዶ ተገቢውን ትኩረት ለተነፈገው ለዘመንኛው የኢትዮጵያ ሥነ-ጥበብና ለሥዓልያኑ አዲስና አማራጭ መድረክ ከመፍጠር አኳያ ታላቅ ሚና ይጫወታሉ።

Most of his earth-muted paintings map out abstract landscapes from a topological viewpoint, to show how nature is being intruded on by humans and how we can trace different stories and dramas on earth.

"The most important point for me is creating connections and starting conversations with my physical space and then converting it to a surreal space. This dream space is a place for me to reflect on memories and translate them into physical echoes."

He is the founding member of Netsa Art Village. As well as various exhibitions in Ethiopia, Tamrat has shown his works in Egypt, Germany, Spain, USA, UAE and Sweden. Tamrat's work as an artist ranges from his studio practice, landscape and portrait painting to installation and performance. However, his enthusiastic research on indigenous knowledge has inculcated his meditations for some time.

Ephrem Solomon

Ephrem Solomon was born in Addis Ababa and graduated from the Entoto Art School in 2009. He observes and presents socio-political works using woodcut and mixed media. Views of the city and the people that inhabit the spaces around him inform his work, as does a fictional world that exists beyond the present. Using black and white to symbolize this ambiguous juncture in reality, he produces bold figures and portraits that capture both personal and public power relations in society.

The Forbidden Fruit series presented here, explores and celebrates the importance of living in the moment. The figures that look to the left, are focused on the past, those facing the right are looking to the present whilst those facing the front are confronting the present. The repetitive motifs resemble natural patterns found in nature; where the beginning and end are difficult to establish. From birth to death, life's journey creates shapes as we make decisions and coincidences and accidents take place. The works remain untitled to allow for limitless readings.

Dawit is also a founding member of Netsa Art Village where he experimented with found objects and recycling, making work from plastic bottles. Dawit has participated in more than thirty group shows and one solo exhibition in Ethiopia and Uganda.

"My inspiration arises from movements, I always perceive movements in patterns, forms and colour. My intention is to transform this perception into paintings using visual language."

His work features in the Saatchi Collection and a solo exhibition opened at Kristin Hjellegjerde gallery in London in March 2015.
